Everything old is new again at the historic Harris Scarfe site

Recycling is taking on a whole new look at the Harris Scarfe redevelopment project in the heart of Adelaide.

Demolition concrete and heavy materials have been removed from the site and taken to ResourceCo's Wingfield site where it has been crushed and recycled and then returned to the site in the form of base material and as aggregate in concrete. This 'closing the loop' in regards to waste management also diverts material from landfill.

The result is a dramatic reduction in the carbon footprint of the project.

"There's a lot of talk about carbon reduction these days, and this project is an example of what many businesses are already doing to reduce their carbon footprint," said ResourceCo Managing Director, Simon Brown.

"ResourceCo offers a full-circle solution to businesses, taking care of all their needs from removal, recycling and supplying construction materials," said Mr Brown.

The \$150million dollar redevelopment project commenced in April, with some of the demolition and removal work being carried out after hours to avoid major disruption to city traffic and shoppers.

ResourceCo employed additional staff and equipment to allow for streamlined night time working conditions.

"It's great that recycled materials from this site are being returned for re-use," said Mark Polec from McMahon Services. Mr Polec said ResourceCo Concrete is supplying all the concrete for the 665 piles to be constructed by McMahon Services.

"ResourceCo Concrete is supplying 3,500 cubic metres of concrete to this project and the materials used originated from this site," he said.
